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WORKSHOP ON "CURRICULUM MAPPING: WHY AND HOW"



The College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan (CPSP) and Colleges of medicine of South Africa organized an "International medical education conference" on 13th and 14th of January 2023 at CPSP, Karachi with the theme "Changing paradigm in postgraduate medical education". A series of over 80 pre-conference workshops were also conducted at various medical Institutions and CPSP Regional centers

in the country. This series of pre-conference workshops was inaugurated by the President CPSP, Prof. Mohammad Shoaib Shafi at the first workshop on "Curriculum Mapping: Why and How" at Liaquat National Hospital on 31st December, 2022. These patients can be offered combined as well as separate pills for ATT. This effort will help all the diagnosed cases of PTB, EPTB and LTB to receive full duration of free of cost therapy with effective monitoring of compliance.

COURSES / WORKSHOPS / SEMINARS

38TH RADIOLOGY CONFERENCE



Department of Radiology at LNH played a dominant role in the 38th Radiology conference held in Karachi between 23rd to 27th November 2022 in collaboration with Royal College of Radiology. Two preconference workshops were held at Liaquat National Hospital including Ultrasound Doppler of varicose veins and ultrsound renal Doppler.

Nine Resident presented their papers in this conference and approximately 21 posters were also contributed in the scientific program.

Dr. Ramsha (R3) received the award of the best paper, Dr. Bisma (R2) received the award of 2nd best poster where as Dr. Uzma (R1) received third prize in the quiz competition.



ADVANCED COURSE FOR FCPS II & MRCP (MEDICINE)

The department of Internal Medicine of LNH is regularly arranging the advanced course for FCPS II & MRCP (Medicine) candidates who have cleared their theory exam, since 2014. This year it was scheduled from September 05 to 10, 2022. Total 34 candidates were registered from all over country including one from Oman & one from Kuwait.



First day briefing of the course was given by Prof. K.U. Makki and then Radiology session on CT scan, MRI & X-Ray was conducted by Radiology faculty. It was followed by TOACS & 12 faculty members of medicine & allied participated in the TOACS session. On 6th, 7th and 8th September 2022 total 27 candidates prepared & presented long cases to the internal and external examiners. Strength and weaknesses of the candidates were concisely discussed after the session by the examiners. On 9th and 10th September 2022 every candidate performed six short cases and counseled by examiners for shortcomings. 25 senior physicians from outside LNH and 32



medicine & allied faculty members, who are examiner of CPSP level, were involved in this extensive course.

Every candidate appreciated the content of the course, variety of patients, team work, course arrangements and guidance given by the examiners.

CERTIFICATE COURSE: BASICS OF EFFECTIVE TEACHING SKILLS FOR NURSING EDUCATORS

The Department of Health Professions Education (DHPE) in collaboration with the Liaquat National College of Nursing (LNCON) organized a two-day certificate course titled "Basics of Effective Teaching Skills for Nursing Educators" from — November 22, 2022. The faculty of LNCON, the Nursing

Edcation Services instructors, and unit heads – Clinical Nursing were among the participants. Nurse educators from other nursing and midwifery institutions of Karachi also attended the course.

It was a hands-on training course which focused on the princi ples of student engagement and ways to improve the teaching / learning process while applying the adult learning principles. The sessions were based on interactive discussions, small-group activities, and presentations. The topics covered included the Basics of



Effective Teaching Skills for Nurse Educators, Interactive Lectures, Metacognitive Note Taking, Effective Power Point Presentations, Lesson Planning, and Psychomotor Skills Training. Prof. Dr. Nighat Huda, Director - Health Care Education Centre, Dr. Sobia Ali, Dr. Afifa Tabassum, and Dr. Sana Faroog Shah were the course facilitators across two days. A certificate distribution ceremony was held on the concluding day. The ceremony was attended by Brig. Dr. Anwer Ali Khan – Controller- Nursing Administration, Prof. Dr. Nighat Huda, Ms. Naseem Kauser – Senior Advisor Nursing, Ms. Samina Iqbal Kanji Chief Nursing Officer, and Mrs. Judith Zaidi – Principal - College of Nursing. CLEFT SURGERY WORKSHOP



The department of Plastic Surgery at Liaquat National hospital and Medical College in collaboration with Pakistan Association of Plastic Surgeons (PAPS) organized a cleft surgery workshop from 24th to 26th November 2022. The workshop included live surgeries conducted by National experts in the field including Plastic Surgeons of Liaquat National Hospital & Medical College. It was conduced by Prof. Shehab Afzal Beg (HOD Plastic Surgery, Liaquat National Hospital) and facilitated by Dr. Afaq Saleem Siddiqui (LNH) & Dr. Obaidur Rahman (LNH).

This was a key event in Plastic Surgery department's educational calendar for 2022, covering wide range of cleft problems from cleft lip, palate, nose and velopharyngeal deformities. More than 20 candidates actively participated in live surgical workshops with an overall attendance of more than 200. The workshop was conduced over three days. On the first day there were live surgical sessions in which participants were briefed regarding various cleft techniques followed by live surgical sessions. On the next two days, experts conducted lectures on the different cleft surgical techniques; Faculty shared there experiences regarding ordinance of complications in cleft surgeries and tips and tricks of cleft surgeries with healthy discussion on various techniques. Several national and international speaker joined the conference, knowledge, ideas and experience were shared amongst the young surgeons to improve their cleft practice.

It was our honor to welcome a number of plastic surgeons from various institutes across the country, the presence of whom helped in enhancing the academic value of the occasion and was an excellent learning opportunity for the attendees.

THE NEONATAL RESUSCITATION PROGRAMME (NRP) WORKSHOP




The Neonatal Resuscitation Programme (NRP) is an educational program which introduces the concepts and basic skills of neonatal resuscitation. It helps in learning cognitive, technical and team work during resuscitating and stabilizing a neonate.

A workshop was held In Liaquat National Hospital on 6th October'2022 in RSDC. The focal person from LNH was Dr. Durre Shahwar Khan. The facilitator was Dr. Misbah Qureshi (Master Trainer NRP, MD). In this workshop two instructors and ten providers were trained overall, including Paediatric residents, NICU nurses and labor room and delivery nurses.

This was a very good opportunity for all the candidates to learn Neonatal resuscitation which will help in providing quality care to our newborns.

The workshop highlighted the importance of clinical audit in hospital settings, its planning, implementation and making those standards achievable.

UPDATE ON HISTOPATHOLOGY



A three days workshop with the title of "Update on Histopathology" was held on 13, 14 and 15 October 2022 at the department of pathology, Liaquat National Hospital. The aim of the workshop was to keep knowledge upto date and understand classification updates / changes based on new information including immunohistochemistry and molecular testing. This provided full depth of diagnostic pathology on common topics like haematolymphoid, kidney, liver, soft tissue and head & neck. Expert of respective subspecialties

of pathology from Karachi and Lahore provided current updates along with basic concepts. The speakers were Dr. Arsalan Ahmed (AKUH), Dr. Mubbarak (SIUT) and Dr. Sajid Mushtaq (SKMCH&RC). It was

an interactive workshop. A total of 35-40 glass slides with microscopes were given daily to participants in the morning session for screening. This was followed by slide view discussion in this afternoon by renowed pathologists. This was attended by approximately 25 participants (FCPS Part 2 trainees and consultants) from various institutes of Karachi including SIUT, DUHS, AKU, BMSI etc. In conclusion it provided a valuable opportunity to participants / FCPS II trainees to screen glass slides and interact / discuss the case with expert Histopathologists who are their FCPS Part 2 examiners as well.



INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL (IPC) PRACTICES

Department of Nursing organized a workshop on "Infection prevention and control practice" on 15th Nov, 2022. The session was conducted by Dr. Muhammad Owais Khan (Assistant Professor – Infectious Diseases) at Convention Centre Hall A. Overall 54 participants, including Team Head, Nursing supervisor, Unit Head, Section Head - Pain management, and the Infection control Team, attended the workshop. The purpose of the workshop was to train the trainer.

The following objectives were covered: general infection prevention guideline for healthcare providers, isolation precaution guideline as per organism, and the effective use of PPE and misuse of PPE in patient care areas.

The participants learnt various skills like ECG interpretation, insulin administration and Inhaler techniques etc. Various consultation skills regarding diabetes, hypertension, chest pain, thyroid disorders, pediatric malnourishment, neonatal examination, elderly care etc. in an interactive manner. The participant's feedback fueled our facilitators' enthusiasm and we look forward to an even more productive second contact session for our 1st batch.



DEVELOPING EXCELLENCE IN NURSING PRACTICES IN UROLOGY



Department of Nursing in collaboration with the department of Urology organized a workshop on urology patient care on 7th November, 2022. The workshop provided the participants the opportunity to educate and update themselves with the latest urological and surgical techniques and to interact with experts. The workshop focused on the importance of early diagnosis and raising awareness to breakdown stigma and encourage people to actively take care of their urological health. Brig Dr. Anwer Ali Khan delivered the welcome address which was followed by Key note address given by Dr. Aziz Abdullah (HOD & Assistant Professor -Urology).

The basic topics covered included discussions on Bladder Health and Bladder Exercise, Urology Screening and other Preventive Urologic Care, and Post TURP care. Other topics covered included Catheterization related com-

plication by Dr. Syed Farhan Ahmed (Assistant Professor/Consultant - Urology), Management of Urinary Incontinence in elders by Dr. Zubda Malik (Consultant, Department of Urology), PCN/Nephrostomy care by Dr. Raj Kumar (SR, Department of Urology), Hands on: Foleys / Supra-pubic catheterization Clean Intermittent Catheterization (CIC), and



Clean intermittent self-catheterization (CISC). Later, the Urology department in collaboration with the Nursing Education Services (NES), discussed the significance of maintaining irrigation chart at the RSDC Skills lab. In the end, Ms. Zohra Javed (Section Head Nursing Education Services) and Ms. Laila A. Rahimi (Section Head Administration - Nursing) gave the closing remarks.

FINGER PRINTING SURVEY AT DEPARTMENT OF FORENSIC MEDICINE



Finger printing is one of the surest sign of identification. There are four types of finger prints present in all kind of population male /female. These days "Biometric system" is well in use in each place including sensitive services, banks, and individual identification data at NADRA. These are the impression left by the friction ridges of a human finger and these formed ridges never change throughout an individual's life.

Analysis of these prints can be through computerized ACE--V (analysis, comparison, evaluation and verification) or by manual method. No two persons have exactly the same arrangement of ridge patterns and the ratio of the same finger print to re-appear is 1 in 64 trillion.

Department of Forensic Medicine & toxicology LNMC survey was conducted and physically finger print by plain ink method were taken from 100 students of 3rd year batch 2025 the results were evaluated and came to be:

Loops ---were ---55% Whorls----were—21%

Composite----11% Arches -----13%

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MANDATORY WORKSHOP FOR IN-HOUSE CANDIDATES (HO'S RMO'S)



In the year 2021-22,77 house officers (HO) of Liaguat National and Medical College were trained for mandatory workshops making them equipped with the basic interpretation of ECG, basic and advance airway management skills and American heart association certified BLS course. The undergraduate medical student of final year MBBS were trained for Trauma Evaluation and Management course (TEAM) with the collaboration of RSDC

and General Surgery team under supervision of Dr. Rufina Soomro. This course enables them to perform skills required in the emergency settings and manage the patients efficiently.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE SKILLS FOR JAFFER PUBLIC SCHOOL



A series of sessions (10) were conducted with the students of Jaffer \square Public school, where approx. 28 participants were oriented in dealing domestic emergencies including managements of Bleeding, Wounds, Fracture, Burns, Heatstroke, Drowning, Fits, Fainting, managements of a person with No breathing and transportation. At the end of



thesession participants were divided in groups to perform group activity of disastrous situation where one group became a group of victims and other group responded as a team of professionals. Participants learned each skills in a healthy environment.

AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION ACCREDITATION COURSES IN LNH

RSDC is an International Training center for American Heart Association Accredited course. We Offer trainings in Basic Life support (BLS), Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS), & Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) to the doctors, Physicians, Surgeons, and health care professionals. We also offers trainings to Community and General public.

BASIC LIFE SUPPORT BLS



Research and Skills Development Centre is an American Heart Association Accredited Training center in Pakistan, providing BLS & ACLS courses on latest AHA 2020 guidelines. RSDC has conducted Total of 42 HeartCode BLS Provider Courses with the Certified AHA Instructors during Sept 2022 to Dec 2022 in which candidates including HO's, RMO's & Nurses and Outsider Candidates were trained. It is an achievement that RSDC have completed their Target to train LNH nursing staff in Heart code BLS in a calendar year, in

CODE BLUE MOCK ACTIVITY

which 818 out of 849 Registered Nursing staff were certified in BLS from November 2021-December 2022.



RSDC & Nursing unit 08&10 organized a Code Blue BLS Mock Drill activities for their nursing staff. Total of 12 activities were observed in the month of November -December 2022. The object of this activities are to review nursing staff's hands on skills in BLS and to review the critical elements while managing crash situations on their patient and how to work in a team and deal the patient in different units of the hospital. Mock drill activity was performed on simulated mannequin which gives real-time experience by generating different cardiac rhythms.

COMMUNITY BASED CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION (CPR) AWARENESS ACTIVITY

ADVANCED CARDIOVASCULAR LIFE SUPPORT (ACLS)



We are pleased to inform that RSDC instructors have successfully completed their American heart association monitoring for BLS & ACLS courses under the supervision of American Heart Association faculty. Advanced Cardiac Life Support is a 2 days Program developed by the American Heart Association (AHA) to improve the skills for Practitioners/docemergency tors/Nurses and Paramedical Staff in emergencies, treating the victims of cardiac arrest or other cardiopulmonary diseases. It helps to recognize life threatening arrhythmias so as to

enable to plan adequate treatment strategies. ACLS Program course contents include Practice While Watching videos including Adult and CPR with the use of Automated External Defibrillator (AED), & Management of Primary and Secondary Airway, Skill Stations for Management of non-arrest rhythms (including Bradyarrythmias and Tachyarrhythmia's with pulse), and pulse-less arrest rhythms (including asystole), Technology Review to learn the difference between Defibrillation and Cardioversion, Video based Recognition of Sign & Symptoms and management of Acute Coronary Syndrome & Acute Ischemic Stroke, Putting it all together for, learning management of one arrhythmia changing to the other. On Completion of the course Liaquat National Hospital & Medical

College RSDC Department awarded certification to the successful candidates which is accredited by the American Heart Association and accepted by all the countries which have adopted AHA based Cardiac life support training as a policy. The certification is valid for two years. Research & Skills Development center LNH&MC conducted monitoring sessions on 25th-26th October 2022 and 29th-30th November 2022. Total of (12) participants attended this session.

Research and Skills Development Centre is proud to launch first ever Pediatrics Advanced Life Support (PALS) Provider Course. PALS courses is a (02) Days Program developed by the American Heart Association (AHA) to improve the skills for Pediatrics Practitioners/doctors/Nurses and Paramedical Staff in different emergencies. The aim of the course is to improve outcomes for pediatric patients by preparing healthcare providers to effectively recognize and intervene in patients with respiratory emergencies, shock, and cardiopulmonary arrest by using high-performance team dynamics and high-quality individual skills. The course includes a series of case scenario practices with simulations that

reinforce important concepts. Features of the PALS course listed realistic, clinical scenarios that encourage active participation — Also delivered through actual pediatric patient videos and lifelike simulations on mannequins , furthermore, a comprehensive systematic approach to assess and treat pediatric patients in emergency situations, and Hands-on class format to reinforce skills proficiency along with Co-branded with the American Academy of Pedi-

atrics (AAP). Recently we have conducted 04 AHA PALS monitoring course and 01 virtually monitored by AHA regional faculty for

FLOOD RELIEF DONATION CAMP AT SYED WAJID ALI COMPLEX, LNH

In July 2022, massive rain and flood destroyed several areas in Pakistan, causing the loss of crops, homes, and livestock. This havoc was inevitably followed by a wave of various waterborne and infectious diseases leaving



the inhabitants of these calamities struck land helpless and in need of medical assistance. Liaquat National Hospital and Medical College and its associated schools of DPT, BSMT, and Nursing in collaboration with the students of the Helping Hands Society of Liaquat National Medical College were at the forefront of running an entire campaign dedicated to aiding the victims of the flood. We set up a donation camp at the Wajid Ali complex to collect monetary donations as well as non-perishable items, clothes, and blankets. The money collected was used to provide the necessities for immediate relief e.g.food,

drinking water, clothing, etc. Apart from that we also traveled across Sindh and Balochistan setting up medical camps with all possible medications absolutely free of cost. The first medical team went to Uthal, Balochistan, along with the Coast Guard Army, and tended to the urgent needs of above two hundred people. Additional camps were set up in Jamshoro and Sohrab Goth,Bin Qasim town, Manora, nearby islands, and various tent cities. Our medical team consisted of senior consultants, surgeons, residents, nurses, pharmacists, physiotherapists, and medical students who oversaw the health issues of those affected. Moreover, any patient who needed further treatment was also offered to be shifted to our tertiary care level hospital without charge. Clinics with different specialties were set up that addressed all issues including gastroenterology, infectious, gynaecology, paediatrics, and so forth. This experience was not only a multi-dimensional learning opportunity for the students through practical clinical work but also highlighted the fundamentals on which Liaquat National Hospital stands which are to help anyone in need, give back to the community, and work as a TEAM. Furthermore, we have decided to allocate a handsome amount of money each year for any natural disaster that may befall Pakistan and to be the front runners in any such situation.

ON-SITE BLS MOCK DRILL: ENHANCING NURSES CONFIDENCE AND READINESS IN MANAGING THE CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION THROUGH A SIMULATION BASED APPROACH IN A TERTIARY CARE HOSPITAL

The resuscitation skills training is required to ensure health professionals manage event to restore life and to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and external defibrillation timely when required. These concepts are delivered to health professionals through the certification of Basic life support (BLS) by trained AHA Instructor. The certification of BLS require on a biannual basis, it cannot be expected that nurses maintain the skills and knowledge without routine application. The use of mock code training, or "Code Drill" simulation based approach help to measures build greater situational team awareness, enhanced interdisciplinary communication, leadership and mutual support which work to alleviate fears, uncertainties and role confusion during a code. The aim of this Quality initiative Project was to enhance the confidence and the readiness of bedside nurses in

In Section 04, K-Block these simulations based mock drills were conducted over a period of three weeks in the month of Nov- Dec 2022 in which we have trained 125 Nurses with an emphasis on hands-on practice as well as teamwork and communication. This project was organised by Ms. Ambreen Khowaja (Section Head Clinical Nursing - K-Block) and Ms. Laila A. Rahimi (Section Head Nursing Administration -K-Block) in Support of RSDC Team and all the Unit Heads of K-Block.
